Patient interaction	Customer service, healthcare liaison
Time management & multitasking	Project coordination, admin support
Tech system proficiency (RxConnect, Epic, etc.)	EMR roles, data entry, IT support

Step 3: Explore Career Paths That Fit

Here are pivot-friendly roles that former pharmacy techs are thriving in:

1. Medical Coding & Billing

- Certification: Yes (e.g., CPC, CBCS)
- Remote-Friendly:
- Why It's a Good Fit: You already understand meds, insurance, and medical terminology.

2. Data Entry / Health Informatics

- Certification: Optional (but Excel/data skills help)
- Why It's a Good Fit: Detail-oriented techs can thrive here – minimal patient contact, often remote.

3. Prior Authorization or Insurance Roles

- Think: PBMs, insurance verification, appeals
- Why It's a Good Fit: You already navigate insurance daily.

4. Tech Support or IT Help Desk

- Skills Needed: Computer/software knowledge, communication
- Why It's a Good Fit: Many pharmacy systems are complex — techs already handle pressure and tech.

5. Admin Assistant / Coordinator Roles

- Industries: Healthcare, education, law, nonprofit
- Why It's a Good Fit: You're organized, deadline-driven, and customer-focused.

6. Pharmaceutical Sales or Reimbursement Rep

- Skills Needed: Communication, networking
- Why It's a Good Fit: You know medications, understand pharmacy operations, and can speak the language.

7. Entrepreneurship / Self-Employment

- Options: CEU development, tutoring, resume services, virtual assistance, wellness coaching
- Why It's a Good Fit: Many techs are building businesses based on their passions or frustrations with the system.

Step 4: Upskill Strategically (Without Going Broke)
